Second, don't forget to get them engaged in your club. Rarely does anyone join Kiwanis to eat lunch (or whatever meal you may have). Presidents, are you conducting New Member Induction ceremonies? Are you conducting a New Member Orientation? Are you finding out which committees and projects align with their desires? Have you invited them to join you for an Interclub meeting? A convention? A training event? A service project? Nobody needs or wants to do everything, but exposing them to the possibilities will help you retain your new "hands for service."

Presidents, Secretaries, and Treasurers all have important roles here to keep the club functioning and growing. Board members should also be monitoring these activities to ensure a viable and fun club for your membership to enjoy. That is when a club can be at its best in serving your community.

All officers and directors – other than the immediate past president – including the secretary unless they are appointed, will be elected at the club's annual meeting by a majority vote, following a process provided in club policy.

If a club is not meeting in person or would prefer to conduct a remote election, follow these guidelines to conduct elections through an online voting website or app:

It is bittersweet that I write my last Georgia Kiwanian article as the Georgia District Circle K Administrator. I retire officially at Midnight on March 31st of this year. I am proud to say in the last 12 years, I have worked with every Georgia Kiwanis District Board and our clubs to give you a Circle K district you can be proud of. As we make this transition, I wanted to bring a few items to your attention.

Circle K International will begin the phase out of the club fee system which served as the way International dues were paid. From now on each Circle K member will be required to pay \$24.00 per person in International Dues. In addition, the Georgia Circle K district dues shall remain \$12.00. Your club can meet this obligation by ensuring they attend the District Club Leadership Training Conference. This year it will take place via zoom on April the 9that noon and will last around 3 hrs. On behalf of the Kiwanis Children's Fund (KCF), I want to take this opportunity to thank the clubs and members of the Georgia District of Kiwanis International for your support. It is because of your commitment and generosity that we can make remarkable things happen to change kids' lives in your communities and communities a world away.

For your information, prenatal care and vaccines to protect mothers and newborn babies from tetanus continue to be supported by your generous donations. Yes, since October 2019, the Kiwanis Children's Fund has granted \$850,000 to support the ongoing efforts to eliminate maternal and neonatal tetanus (MNT). During this same period, we granted **\$336,000** to fight iodine deficiency disorders in Morocco and Myanmar. With the leadership of Governor Byron, the Georgia District's support for the Kiwanis Children's Fund remains strong. He has made the KCF one of his six priority projects for the year. As of February 28, 2022, the District has contributed \$22,958 the KCF. Of this, \$13,369 was contributed by the clubs and \$9,589 was contributed by individuals. 69 clubs in the District have made contributions. To date, the KCF has raised \$544,914, through Districts' giving.

If your club has not already made its contribution to the KCF, please consider doing so. I have already made contact with many of the clubs in the District and will continue to reach out to those that I have not

contacted. I would hope that each club in the Georgia District is working toward becoming a distinguished club. A gift to the KCF is one of the requirements to achieve this designation.

Know that each District is a trusted partner of Kiwanis International, and they are depending on each of us for support. The Kiwanis Children's Fund has a saying that, "Kids need Kiwanis, and the Kiwanis Children's Fund helps you reach them." I know I can count on you to support your Foundation!

INTERCLUB TIPS

Tim Goodman

Interclub Chairman Kiwanis Club of Swainsboro

Inter-clubbing is a means of supporting Kiwanis' fifth Object, which is, "To provide, through this club, a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service, and to build a better community." This wider scope of Kiwanis can be achieved by arranging visits between clubs in the same town, division, and district, as well as inter-district get-togethers. Inter-clubbing also should include the goal of meaningful interaction and information sharing. Some ways to increase interclub activities include the following:

- 1. Get an Interclub Chair and/ or form an Interclub Committee (Most significant of all). When you want to do an interclub, contact the Interclub Chair, the Club President, or the Club Secretary. The Georgia Directory (2021dd2022) has that information on the President and Secretary, but not the Interclub Chair.
- 2. Develop incentives to do interclubs. Prepare an inter-club membership roster and record participation of club members in inter-club meetings. There is an existing incentive

(Outstanding Kiwanian) in the District and develop programs of your own.

- 3. Develop a Division Speaker's List so there can be Program Sharing. One phase of this involves having one club take a program to another club. Each time this is done, a delegation from the program-presenting club should go with the program presenter.
- 4. Use special occasions and events like charter nights for new clubs, club anniversary celebrations for established clubs, and special activities for some clubs are excellent times to do interclubs. Be sure you have or get invitations to attend.
- 5. Inter-clubbing is an excellent means of following up new members' induction training. They will begin to see the broader scope of Kiwanis and learn of the fine work being done by the SLP's and relationships between the SLP and the Kiwanis club.
- 6. Take advantage of all current division/district opportunities to do interclubs (Governor's Rallies, division council meetings, face-to-face and virtual trainings, conventions, charter nights, special celebrations, etc.)

DID YOU KNOW?

In 1936, the "Circle K House" at Washington State College was established by the Kiwanis Club of Pullman, Washington. Organized as a fraternity, Kappa lota Phi served men who needed financial aid to attend college. Kiwanians also wanted to provide collegiate students leadership opportunities for their future careers and work service projects to better their communities while having a sense of fellowship.

In 1947, Circle K changed from a fraternity to a service organization. That year, the first Circle K club was chartered at Carthage College in Carthage, Illinois.

Circle K was introduced in Georgia in 1949 by Dr. George M. Sparks of the Atlanta Kiwanis Club. The first club was chartered on February 22, 1950 at what is now Georgia State University. The Georgia District of Circle K was formed in 1959 under the direction of Mr. J. R. Griggs with 18 clubs. In 2009, Georgia Circle K celebrated its 50th Anniversary.

Over the years, thousands of members have impacted thousands more with their selfless acts of service.

"Your brand is what other people say about you when you're not in the room" said Jeff Bezos, the founder, chairman, and chief executive officer of Amazon.com.

A brand isn't just about a logo. It's what you feel and your anticipation of what you will feel and experience when you interact with a certain company or product.

Many clubs are stuck in the continuous cylce of using the same thing over and over again to promote their club and projects. We are all busy and it's easier to just use what has been used in the past. Believe me, I get that!

But it's important to stay fresh and to make sure you update your marketing materials on a regular basis.

Is your logo correct? Colors match the Kiwanis brand? Contact info up-to-date? Is your social media and website easily accessible?

Right now, the Kiwanis brand is really diluted with clubs and districts doing their own brand designs and logos. Together, we need to work on improving this.

The first step we need to take is to start using the correct logo on everything we do, print, publish, share, etc. It needs to be in the frontline of everything we do.

The logo is the part of the brand that connects your feelings with the group. It's a trigger. For example, when you think of Starbucks... when you see their logo, can't you already smell their coffee? Their logo triggers your emotions and your senses. THAT is successful branding.

That's why, when we talk about our image and messaging, our brand-and especially the logo-it's so important to be consistent. We want the public to instantly recognize us and know our mission!

So let's start now by honoring, protecting, and lifting up our Kiwanis brand. Let's show the world that Kiwanis is here, that we are here to help, and that kids need Kiwanis.

□ LOGO TRANSITION

If you are still using the oval "birdcage/globe" logo, change it out for the current Kiwanis logo. Search high and low to make sure all logos have been replaced with the new. Go here to download the Kiwanis logo: www.kiwanis.org/clubs/member-resources/logos

If your club doesn't have a customized logo, request one here for free: www.kiwanis.org/clubs/member-resources/logos-and-assets/custom-logo-requests

You can either use your customized club logo (preferred on club materials) or the Kiwanis International Logo (preferred on generic Kiwanis materials).

□ CLUB PROMOTIONS

Double check to make sure the correct version of the logo is on all of your promotional materials such as flyers, brochures, newsletters, banners, etc. We encourage you to use your customized club logo as much as you can on your club promotionals.

Check to see if the Kiwanis brand colors, fonts, and styles are evident on these materials. Every little bit helps make the Kiwanis brand stronger. Check out the Kiwanis Brand Book for guidelines: www.kiwanis.org/clubs/member-resources/kiwanis-brand-campaign

□ EVENTS

For your service projects and events, the Kiwanis Brand guidelines are a tad bit more slack. You are not required to use the Kiwanis colors, fonts, and styles but you must have the correct logo (custom club logo or the Kiwanis logo).

Make sure your Kiwanis Club name and logo are present on all club sponsored event materials such as flyers, banners, signs, announcements, etc. Show your club pride!

☐ SOCIAL MEDIA / FACEBOOK

Refresh your club's social media accounts with new posts and updated photos. Make sure contact information and club information is up-to-date. This is a great source to show what your club is doing. Completed a service project recently? Share a photo of the project! This is your chance to show how fun and involved your club is.

Kiwanis International has some great ready to use 15-or-30 second video clips for easy, eye-catching posts that you can make. Download/share the video clips from here: www.kiwanis.org/clubs/member-resources/kiwanis-brand-campaign. There, you will also find some ready to use social media graphics such as Facebook cover photos, social media square graphics, etc.

If you don't already have a club facebook page, now is the time to start!

■ WEBSITE

Make sure all the information on your website is current and up-to-date. Think about photos, contact information, service project calendar, event calendar, dues, etc. Your official club logo should be prominent on the header of the website.

The Kiwanis brand needs to be carried out throughout the website theme, such as with colors, fonts, graphics, etc.

If you do not already have a club website, we encourage you to create one! We recommend using Weebly to host and be your editing platform.

☐ CLUB MARKETING/PR CHAIR

Every club should try to have a PR/Marketing Committee and/or Chair to help maintain the club's branding and Marketing efforts. This committee can be responsible for the club's social media, website, media outreach, graphic design needs, etc.

□ COMMUNITY MEDIA OUTREACH

The media is tricky business, but it's important to try to have your Marketing/PR Committee reach out to the local media on getting articles published about projects your club is doing or have completed. You may get rejected, but you never know when they will have the space for your piece so keep submitting and try again and again!

Kiwanis has lots of ready-to-go graphics that are great for media outreach with TV spotlights, radio spotlights, billboards, print ads, etc. All of these can be customized to include your club's information. Visit kiwanis.org/brand to download these materials.

☐ GA DISTRICT MARKETING & PR COMPETITION

Your club is invited to participate in the annual GA District Marketing & Public Relations Competition! This is a great opportunity for your club to showcase your work and to get ideas on how you can improve your club's marketing, public relations, and Kiwanis branding.








CARROLLTON KIWANIANS READ TO 13 SCHOOLS






JESUP KIWANIS READING PROJECT
