


GEORGIA DISTRICT CLUBS

INTERCLUB OPPORTUNITIES

Interclub visits are fun and informative and can lead to enduring friendships. They also give you an opportunity to see what other Clubs are doing, allowing you to adopt those activities that can benefit your Club. Kiwanis International encourages Clubs close to newly chartered Clubs to assist the new Clubs in learning how to conduct business the "Kiwanis Way." Some Divisions have members join the new Club and serve in leadership roles the first year to make a smooth transition into Kiwanis International.

- 1. It requires two members from a Club to count as an "official" interclub visit.
- 2. Clubs will receive a banner patch IF they complete the Interclub Challenge. A Club must make a minimum of eight interclub visits. Seven of those visits must be within your Division with different Clubs. If your Division has less than seven opportunities, you may double up with other Clubs. One interclub visit must be with a Club outside your Division. SLPs. Training Conferences, and Conventions do not count for the Interclub Challenge.
- 3. Patches will also be given to the top 10 Clubs who have the most visits and to the top 10 Clubs who have the highest miles travelled at the end of the Kiwanis year (Sep 30, 2023). **SLPs. Training Conferences, and Conventions do not count for the Interclub Challenge.**
- 4. Remember to report all interclubs on your monthly reports and to me to assure you have credit for completing the challenge. You must notify me in addition to entering the visits on the Secretary Dashboard.

So, this year you will be accumulating points all year long. The more points you accumulate, the closer you get to the Gold level.

Take a look at Leadership Education. A club's President, Secretary, and Treasurer earn one point each by attending Georgia CLE (which will be offered again at our Fall Training Conference). If they attended training before October 1, they each earn two more points. So, if all three attended training early, the club earned 9 points toward Distinguished.

We will have three levels of Distinguished. All three will earn a banner patch. Clubs that achieve Gold level will receive special recognition.

Kiwanis International will recognize PINNACLE CLUBS. To achieve PINNACLE, Clubs will need to meet the following criteria:

GROWTH (Must accomplish two of three)

• Minimum of 10% net increase in membership over the prior year's membership, as certified by October 10, 2023.

• Sponsorship of a new Kiwanis club during the year.

• Participation in the Two For Two program all 12 months of the year, as reported in the club's official monthly reports.

AND

SERVICE (Must accomplish two of three)

• Minimum required increase in overall giving to the Kiwanis Children's Fund (as determined by the Children's Fund).

• Participation in the Kiwanis Signature Project Contest during the administrative year.

• Increase in the number of specific or overall Service Leadership Programs clubs in good standing during the previous administrative year.

Clubs can achieve Distinguished and Pinnacle. You don't have to achieve one to achieve the other. I am looking forward to all the clubs that achieve BOTH.

WHAT CAN YOU DO IN ONE DAY?



Every year, Kiwanis club members around the world gather on the fourth Saturday in October for Kiwanis One Day. It's a day set aside for clubs to work together to better their communities – and to invite friends and family to join them.

This year, Kiwanis One Day will be

October 22, 2022. As many clubs return to active service, be sure your club follows local guidelines and restrictions for gathering. You can find additional information about gatherings, social distancing and other important health updates at the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and World Health Organization (WHO) websites.

An additional initiative this year is Celebrate Community, an opportunity to participate in service projects with other volunteer organizations, including Lions Clubs International, **Optimist International and Rotary** International. This joint effort encourages clubs to work together to have a greater impact on their communities. All clubs in the Kiwanis family are encouraged to participate. More information and suggested projects can be found at kiwanis.org/celebratecommunity. For clubs that want to team up with other members of the Kiwanis family, One Day remains a perfect opportunity. Reach out to other Kiwanis family clubs: Aktion Club, Circle K International, Key Club, K-Kids and/or Builders Club. Popular projects for One Day include park cleanup, playground maintenance and painting local shelters.

And invite others to join you! One Day is an ideal way to introduce your family, friends and colleagues to Kiwanis. When you show potential members a project that helps kids, you engage them in the Kiwanis mission. After One Day, invite your guests to your club's in-person or online meeting. And be sure to share your One Day projects on your social media channels. Use the #OneDay hashtag if you are sharing a Kiwanis One Day project.

If your club wants to host a One Day activity, follow these steps for a successful day:

STEP 1: GET STARTED

The key to a successful project is to begin planning months in advance. Begin by appointing a Kiwanis One Day ambassador from your club.

STEP 2: FORM A COMMITTEE

Kiwanis One Day success depends on proper planning. Begin by conducting a planning meeting and invite all interested members. At this meeting, provide the basic information on Kiwanis One Day and go over the various subcommittee responsibilities. The more volunteers the better. Don't limit the committee; rather, ask for club-wide participation!

STEP 3: SELECT A PROJECT

STEP 4: FORM SUBCOMMITTEES

Delegate tasks to subcommittees to handle volunteer recruitment, logistics and other important tasks. Suggested subcommittees and responsibilities include: Volunteer Recruitment, Logistics, Community Networking, Hospitality, and Public Relations/Social Media.

STEP 5: SHARE YOUR STORY

Kiwanis One Day provides clubs

with a chance to draw attention to their impact on the community. Take photos at your event, share them via Facebook, Twitter or Instagram. Post on Pinterest. Mention @Kiwanis to tag Kiwanis International and post action photos throughout the day. Also use the Kiwanis One Day hashtag #KiwanisOneDay in your posts.

STEP 6: INVITE SPECIAL GUESTS

Inviting special guests to your Kiwanis One Day event is a great idea. It creates community awareness about your club and helps build quality relationships with local officials. Think about who makes a difference in your community and invite them to your event!

STEP 7: REPORT YOUR SUCCESS

Clubs that participate in Kiwanis One Day should report the events, including service hours and other key data, on the Monthly Report form. This helps Kiwanis track and measure service projects, participation, and help improve our programs.




